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House system

- Healthy competition; sports, debating, rewards, spelling bees ...
- Opportunities for house collaboration 3-18

Uniform

- Both schools the same except for polo/shirt colour (KAB – white, KAO – powder blue)
- Tartan pinafore or black trousers/shorts, King's polo shirt, cardigan or jumper
- PE kit of shorts, King's navy polo shirt and optional sweatshirt

Will morph into secondary uniform as students progress through the school. Shirts and ties from year 3



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Dates and Times of School Day

(Normal timings - these are currently different due to Covid restrictions)

- Largely compliant with Bracknell Forest Term Dates
- Core primary school hours: 8.45am – 3.30pm
- Flexible drop-off from 8.30am
- Wrap around care 7.30am – 6.00pm (provided by Funtastic Kids)
- After school clubs 3.30pm – 4.15pm

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Attendance Matters

Our expectation of **all**: 97+%

97%	=	3.5 days missed in total
95%	=	8 days missed in total or 1 week and 3 days
90%	=	16 days missed in total or 3 weeks and 1 day
85%	=	24 days missed in total or 4 weeks and 4 days
80%	=	32 days missed in total or 6 weeks and 2 days

- We will work with information gathered from home visits and current pre-schools;
- Speech and Language Therapist works with the school, provision continues from work already being carried out
- Assess, plan, do, review
- Early identification of needs
- Differentiation within the classroom as far as possible
- Focus on a truly inclusive ethos in all aspects of the curriculum


Example of Welcome/Energy Snacks (available 3.15 - 4.30pm)

Low sugar squash and water.

Example of Afternoon Tea (available 4.40 - 6pm)

Low sugar squash and water.
Tomatoes/cucumbers/peppers.



Hot Options:

Jacket potato with beans, cheese, coleslaw,
or tuna mayonnaise.

Pizza (meat and vegetarian).

Toast with beans or spaghetti hoops.

Macaroni cheese.

Sausage or cheese rolls.

Soup (tomato/vegetarian/minestrone) and bread roll.

Chicken nuggets/vegetarian nuggets and beans/dips.

Cold Option:

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Transition to KAB in Y7

- From KAB primary it is direct - unless parents wish for an alternative secondary school
- KAO is officially a separate school with a separate DFE Number
- In Y6, KAO parents will need to apply for a place
- A criterion will be consulted upon and added to admissions policy for the 2024 intake (the first year there is a Y6 cohort) to include priority 'for children transferring to Year 7 and attending the linked primary academy, King's Academy Oakwood'
