Behaviour, expectations and DARE points



Children are expected to follow our DARE values. Assemblies and class discussions ensure children know exactly what this looks like.

Children are rewarded DARE points for showing our values. These points add up to individual, whole class and house awards.

Individual points:

- 10 points = A sticker
- 25 points = Smelly sticker
- 35 points = Rubber
- 50 points = Pencil
- 65 points = Ruler
- 80 points = Bronze Certificate
- 100 points = Silver Certificate
- 120 points = Gold Certificate
- 160 points = Platinum Certificate
- 200 points = Golden Ticket

Whole Class points:

- 1000 points = A whole class fun activity
- 2000 points = A whole class movie afternoon
- 3000 points = Whole class special day

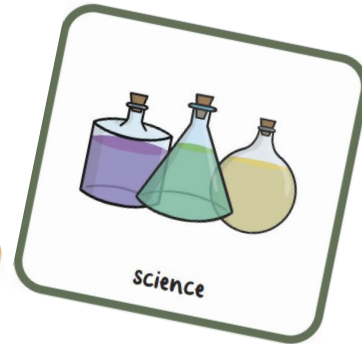
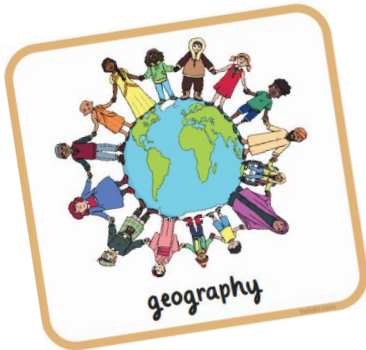


The foundation subjects in Year 6

- You will receive a curriculum letter each term which details what is taught
- The foundations subjects are:

PSHE, history, geography, R.E., P.E., science, Spanish, art and design, design and technology, music

- Some are taught every week and some are alternated each half term.



Maths - calculation methods in Year 6

Skill: Add with up to 3 decimal places **Year: 5**

Place value counters and plain counters on a place value grid are the most effective manipulatives when adding decimals with 1, 2 and then 3 decimal places.

Ensure children have experience of adding decimals with a variety of decimal places. This includes putting this into context when adding money and other measures.

$2.41 + 3.65 = 6.06$

Skill: Multiply 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers **Year: 5/6**

When multiplying 4-digits by 2-digits, children should be confident in the written method.

If they are still struggling with times tables, provide multiplication grids to support when they are focusing on the use of the method.

Consider where exchanged digits are placed and make sure this is consistent.

$2,739 \times 28 = 76,692$

Skill: Subtract numbers with more than 4 digits **Year: 5/6**

Place value counters or plain counters on a place value grid are the most effective concrete resource when subtracting numbers with more than 4 digits.

At this stage, children should be encouraged to work in the abstract, using column method to subtract larger numbers efficiently.

$294,382 - 182,501 = 111,881$

Skill: Divide multi-digits by 2-digits (long division) **Year: 6**

Children can also divide by 2-digit numbers using long division.

Children can write out multiples to support their calculations with larger remainders.

Children will also solve problems with remainders where the quotient can be rounded as appropriate.

$432 \div 12 = 36$

$7,335 \div 15 = 489$

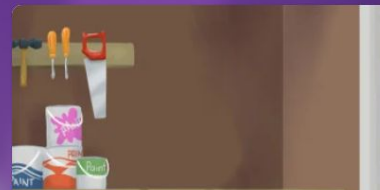

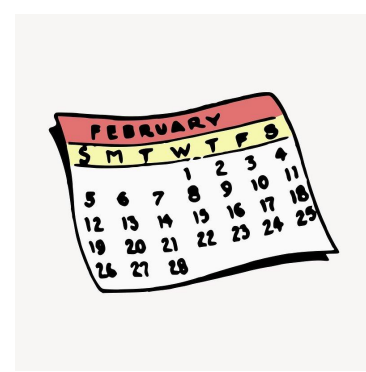
